Using the values promoted by The HILLS Way of Respect, Integrity, Courage, Empathy and Excellence, a safe and engaging learning environment has been developed that promotes curiosity, discovery, independence and fun.

The school provides a wide range of co-curricular and extra-curricular opportunities, including year level camps and experiences which are a highlight for students.

With the founding ELC Director, Rosie Ferguson retiring, HILLS now seeks an outstanding and inspirational Christian leader who can continue to provide strong leadership during this next stage of our ELC.

OUR STORY ELC to Year 12 One Campus School

HILLS opened in February 1983, in the former Verdun Primary School premises situated on Onkaparinga Valley Road, Verdun. The school has grown in enrolments from modest numbers to an enrolment of over 600 from the Early Learning Centre to Secondary School.

HILLS is a non-denominational School which was established by parents who desired a good standard of education for their children in a caring, environment, where Christian values and principles were actively supported and nurtured.

HILLS has no formal links to any particular church or denomination but maintains close informal links with all local Christian churches. The school is open (as far as its resources shall permit) to all students regardless of their parents' economic status and church affiliation, provided that the parents can genuinely support the aims of the school.





During the last 15 to 20 years, HILLS has developed significantly to become a school of choice within the Adelaide Hills. The staged developments have included :

- In July 2009, the opening of a purpose-built Early Learning Centre (ELC) for 3 ½ to 5 year old pre-schoolers, together with Out of School Hours Care facilities and car park.
- The construction of a Multi-Purpose Gym, which incorporates a full-size basketball court, kitchen, and a classroom.
- Four general purpose classrooms across Sandow Lane.
- In January 2013, HILLS commenced a Secondary School at Oakbank with a Year 8 class. In 2020, the completion of a purpose built Secondary learning spaces at Verdun allowed HILLS to become a 'One Campus' ELC to Year 12 learning community.
- Purchasing the adjoining nine acre property which includes Onkaparinga River frontage, five undeveloped acres across the river and a historic house for our students and staff to enjoy. Through partnerships with local authorities and ease of access to the natural environment, the school has developed a strong focus on nature play and environmental studies.
- An extension to the Administration building opened in 2014.
- The aforementioned historic house was renovated and refurbished to provide a wonderful, engaging and exciting learning space for students. The Centre, known as *Rivermont*, is now delivering an innovative teaching and learning program that includes an exciting *Garden to Kitchen* program. The students agree that it is a great space and a privilege to work in.
- Extensive planting and re-vegetation to develop natural playgrounds and environmental learning spaces.
- In 2018, the purchase of a five acre property adjacent to the school that is now the home of our newly developed Secondary School.
- A recently built middle school building, with music centre, opened in 2024.
- Work has recently began on our Recreation Precinct, with the oval space ready for use in 2025.

The ELC Director will collaborate with the Head of Primary and Head of Secondary to ensure a seamless one school approach. Other key relationships include the Business Manager, Director of People, Culture and Operations and OSHC Director.

A DAY IN THE ELC

An example of a typical day, which follows a flexible routine, is outlined below.

- 6.00 ELC closes

HILLS ELC sessions run 8.45am to 3.15pm Monday to Friday during school Terms.

Before and after school care, begins 7.30am and closes 6.00pm and we offer a vacation care program each school holiday. The centre is open 50 weeks of the year.

HILLS ELC is a fully registered national long day care centre so families can access child care benefits for greater affordability.





PLANNING AND PRACTICE

Learning design is guided by the National Quality Standards and the Early Years Learning Framework: Belonging Being and Becoming. Additionally, we draw on best practice methodologies including Reggio principles and nature pedagogy to inform planning and practice.

Reggio Emilia Principles

Reggio Emilia principles provide a helpful lens for considering how we work with children and approach learning. In particular there are helpful considerations around our image of children, partnerships with families and the wider community, and how we prepare learning environments and document children's learning. These principles have gained worldwide acclaim for their influence in shaping early years learning.

We draw inspiration from forest school initiatives in Scotland and Scandinavian countries to enhance our passion and commitment for learning about, in and with nature.

LEARNING SPACES

Our commitment to outdoor learning is a distinguishing feature and we take full advantage of our stunning natural spaces. This is a part of our daily routine in all seasons and every morning you will find the children on the property, exploring, taking measured risks, collaborating and thinking independently. Children are free to develop their sense of wellbeing and innate wonder.

Children also access HILLS outstanding facilities, such as the library, gymnasium and play areas, and participate in specialist PE lessons.

Our purpose-built ELC offers thoughtfully planned indoor-outdoor spaces to meet children's curiosity and hunger to learn. Open-ended resources, rich in natural and repurposed loose parts, mean children can use what they find to develop their ideas and follow their imaginations. Educators come alongside to enrich, encourage and extend.

NATURE PLAY

As a school, HILLS has chosen to make Nature Play opportunities a priority through the purchase of the adjacent Rivermont Property. The ELC is founded on providing meaningful learning opportunities for its students, so we naturally take every opportunity to bring nature into our program and venture forth into nature as often as we can! The ELC's daily morning WILD WALKS around the School and Rivermont property allow the children to observe seasonal changes or look for something specific, as well as providing a physical activity that stimulates their brains for further learning throughout the day. Twice a week we engage in our WILD WORK, visiting the Property and venturing into "The Faraway Lands" for extended exploration and learning times in the natural environment.





HOW TO APPLY Guidelines for Preparing the Application

The written application must include the following:

- 1. Application Form including 3 referees, preferably one of whom is a Pastor.

Selection Process

Applicants should be aware that interviews will be conducted at the Hills Christian Community School on dates listed below. Interviews with interstate applicants may be conducted via an online video conference. The respective merits of each of the applicants will be assessed against the Pre-requisites and the Key Selection Criteria. The panel will use the Selection Criteria to assess each applicant's written application, responses to questions asked at the interview, and performance on any other task which may form part of the selection process.

The selection process will be conducted by the selection panel with complete confidentiality.
