OUR STORY

ELC to Year 12 One Campus School

HILLS opened in February 1983, in the former Verdun Primary School premises situated on Onkaparinga Valley Road, Verdun. The school has grown in enrolments from modest numbers to an enrolment of over 650 from the Early Learning Centre to Secondary School.

HILLS is a non-denominational School which was established by parents who desired a good standard of education for their children in a caring, environment, where Christian values and principles were actively supported and nurtured.

HILLS has no formal links to any particular church or denomination but maintains close informal links with all local Christian churches. The school is open (as far as its resources shall permit) to all students regardless of their parents' economic status and church affiliation, provided that the parents can genuinely support the aims of the school. During the last 15 to 20 years, HILLS has developed significantly to become a school of choice within the Adelaide Hills. The staged developments have included:

- Opening of a purpose-built Early Learning Centre (ELC) for 3 ½ to 5 year old pre-schoolers, together with Out of School Hours care facilities and car park.
- The construction of a multi-purpose hall, which incorporates a full-size basketball court, extensive kitchen, performing arts classroom and three instrumental music rooms.
- Four general purpose classrooms across Sandow Lane.
- In January 2013, HILLS commenced a Secondary School at Oakbank with a Year 8 class. In 2020, the completion of a purpose built Secondary learning spaces at Verdun allowed HILLS to become a 'One Campus' ELC to Year 12 learning community.
- HILLS purchased the adjoining nine acre property which includes Onkaparinga River frontage, five undeveloped
 acres across the river and a historic house for our students and staff to enjoy. Through partnerships with local
 authorities and ease of access to the natural environment, the school has developed a strong focus on nature
 play and environmental studies.
- An extension to the Administration building opened in 2014.
- The aforementioned historic house was renovated and refurbished to provide a wonderful, engaging and exciting learning space for students. The Centre, known as *Rivermont*, is now delivering an innovative teaching and learning environment that includes an exciting Digital Technologies and Nature Science program including the wonderful Stephanie Alexander *Kitchen Garden* program. The students agree that it is a great space and a privilege to work in.
- Extensive planting and re-vegetation to develop natural playgrounds and environmental learning spaces.
- In 2018, the purchase of a five acre property adjacent to the school that is now the home of our newly developed Secondary School.
- A recently built middle school building, with music centre, opened in 2024.
- Work has recently began on our Recreation Precinct, with the oval space ready for use in 2025.

WILKINS PROJECT

The Wilkins Project is an authentic project-based learning methodology that was developed to meet the needs of all HILLS students in Years 7 to 10. Recognising that the first years of secondary schooling mark a significant time in an adolescent's development, we have created a program that allows time for exploration of personal interests, and enables the growth of self-identity.

THE RITE JOURNEY

A key feature to our Year 9 Curriculum is The Rite Journey which is an established year-long program that integrates healthy rites of passage to prepare students for their transition into adulthood.

PEDAL PRIX

The Middle School Pedal Prix program was established by a team of students as part of the Wilkins Project. The school now runs three trikes, including an all- girls team.

CAMPS

The Year 7 cohort have an aquatics camp, the Year 8 class ventures to Robe for the South East Coastal Experience while the flagship camp for all Middle School students is the Tasmanian Wilderness Experience that is completed as part of their Year 9 studies.



SENIOR SCHOOL YEARS 10-12

A Place for Future Discoverny

HILLS endeavours to teach, guide and encourage students to become vibrant scholars who are able to learn independently, respect the rights of others, who are willing to serve the community and be passionate about life.

The education opportunities at HILLS help students to excel by giving them the tools to explore their inner strengths, strive for their goals and achieve high academic results. Our School has an excellent reputation for developing students to be the best version of themselves ready for future opportunities and challenges. Our students are known, nurtured and encouraged to not just settle for the ordinary... they will learn to be extraordinary!

The seeds of intrinsic motivation are nurtured as students gain independence and are given the trust and respect to take responsibility for their learning.

In Year 10 students commence their three-year journey towards SACE Accreditation. This year marks the culmination of their Wilkins Journey, where students entrepreneurship skills are put to the test. Students embark on a challenging service adventure on Kangaroo Island, and are presented with numerous co-curricular activities including the annual Ski Trip and Generations in Jazz for those with a passion for music.

Year 11 students have an extensive choice of subjects to select from for their pathway to University, TAFE or the workforce. We also assess the General Capabilities of the Australian Curriculum. Working with Melbourne University and the SACE Board of SA, we are now on our 4th year of a journey in developing a Learner Profile that will complement the assessment records of each student. Students have an exciting and cultural experience in Melbourne for their camp.

Year 12 at HILLS is a special year for all students. We encourage students to challenge themselves in their studies, to develop as leaders and pursue areas of interest. Students undertake several leadership retreats, and the year culminates with a celebration breakfast and Senior Formal. Students also have the opportunity to consider a range of co-curricular activities including the School Musical and the Japanese Immersion Experience.

Selection Process

The selection panel regards the selection process as a confidential two-way communication process involving applicants and the panel.

The selection panel reserves the right to contact relevant referees contained in the application form.

Applications that are incomplete, or do not address the matters listed above, may not be considered further.

Applicants will be selected for interview by the selection panel based on assessment of their written application.

Applicants should be aware that interviews will be conducted at the Hills Christian Community School on dates to be determined by the selection panel. Interviews with interstate applicants may be conducted via an online video conference. The respective merits of each of the applicants will be assessed against the Pre-requisites and the Key Selection Criteria. The panel will use the Selection Criteria to assess each applicant's written application, responses to questions asked at the interview, and performance on any other task which may form part of the selection process.

The selection process will be conducted by the selection panel with complete confidentiality.





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
